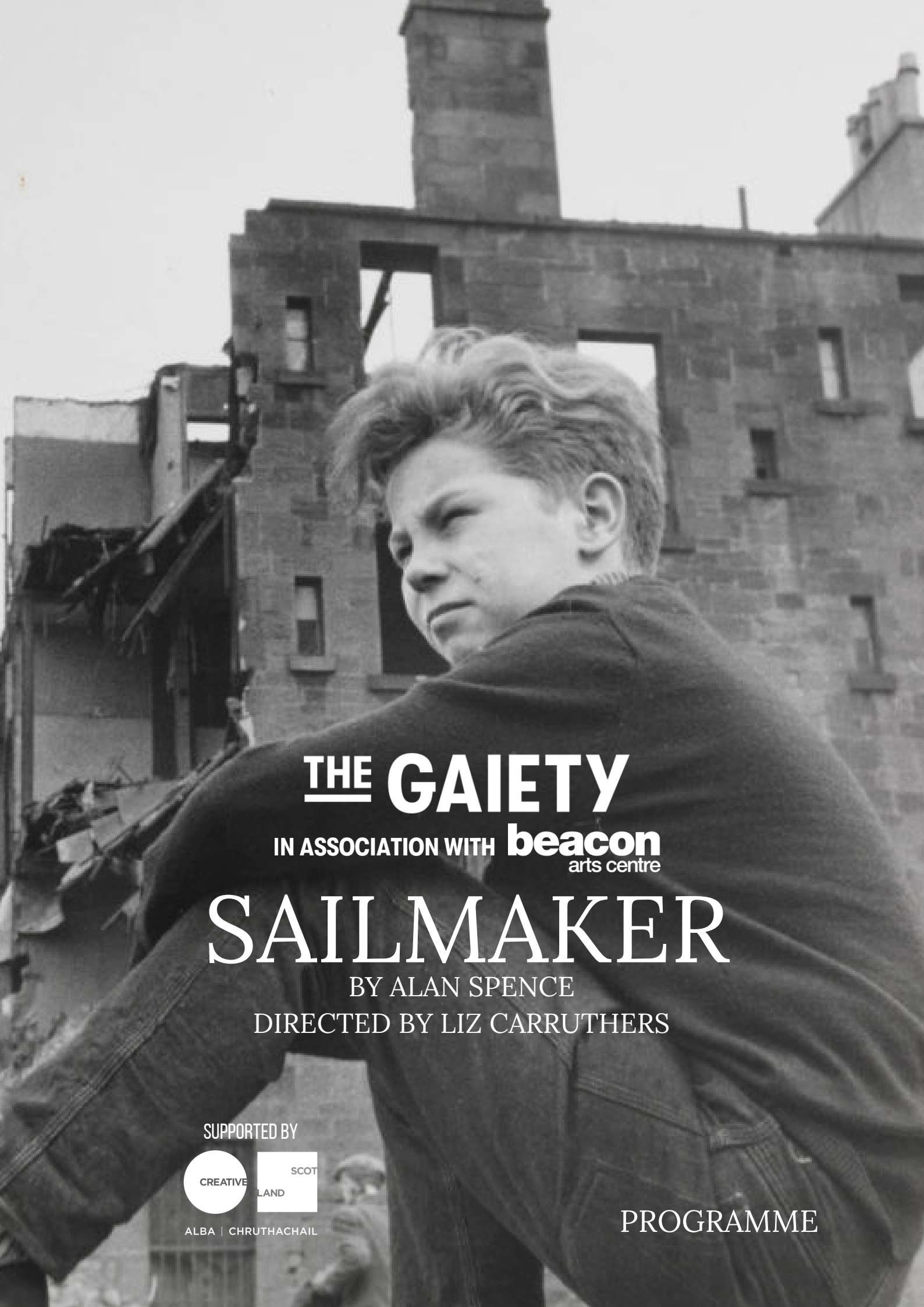

WRITER'S INTRODUCTION

Sailmaker was my first full-length stage play, commissioned by the Traverse Theatre Edinburgh, and performed there back in 1982. A new version was staged by TAG (Theatre About Glasgow) in 1990. There was a BBC radio version in the 90s and the published script has been in print since that first Traverse production, finding new life as a set text in Scottish schools. (One school librarian told me it was the most stolen book from their shelves, which I'll take as a kind of compliment!) But it's particularly exciting for me that the play is being revived now, in this magical new version by a brilliant company, brought to life as a live production for a whole new audience.

I find the experience fascinating and bittersweet. At one level, the play is deeply personal. There are many autobiographical elements - the story at the heart of it is my own - but I've been gratified to realise its themes are universal. When poet and playwright Liz Lochhead first saw it she said it was a feminist play, where the lack of a female dimension in the (male) characters' lives became a strong presence. A left wing friend said it was a powerful socialist statement, and a Buddhist friend was equally adamant it was a Buddhist play, with its themes of transience and impermanence. For my part, I'm happy with all these responses, as I was with one of the first reviews which simply called it 'a great wee play.' I'll settle for that any day!

So thanks to all involved in putting the play back on stage, and to all the teachers who have taught it, and all the students who have enjoyed it. Cheers!

Alexander Tait graduated with a BA Hons in Acting and English from Edinburgh Napier University. Recent theatre credits include *Death Of An Influencer* (A Play, A Pie and A Pint), *Kev Campbell Was He*, written and performed by Alexander, which received multiple awards at the 2024 Edinburgh Fringe Festival and toured as part of A Play, A Pie and A Pint's Spring 2025 Season.

Other credits include *HER* (Traverse), *One, Two, Three* (Traverse) and *Graveyard of the Outcast Dead* (Duns Play Fest). From 2021 - 2024 he was a performer for The Improverts, Edinburgh's longest running improvised comedy group, and was also the group's director in 2023.

ANDY CLARK AS DAVIE

Andy studied at Dundee College and RSAMD (now RCS) and was a member of Dundee Rep Ensemble from 2000-03, appearing in over 20 productions including *The Plague*, *The Mill Lavvies*, *Mince*, *The Land of Cakes* and *The Winter's Tale*. Other theatre work includes *Make It Happen* (NTS), *Wild Rose* (Royal Lyceum/Caledonia Productions), *So Young* (Traverse Theatre), *Tally's Blood* (Perth/Cumbernauld/Ayr Gaiety), *Tartuffe*, *The Cherry Orchard* (Lyceum), *A Steady Rain* (Theatre Jezebel/Tron), *Little Sure Shot* (Leeds Playhouse/The Egg), *Gastronauts* (Royal Court), *I'm With The Band* (Traverse), *Vernon God Little* (Young Vic) *Lampedusa*, *The Libertine*, *Hamlet*, *Othello*, *Peter Pan* and *A Handful of Dust* (Citizens).

Liz has been a theatre director for nearly 40 years.

She was trainee director at Perth Theatre, Staff Director at Chichester Festival Theatre and Artistic Director of Cumbernauld Theatre.

She has directed plays for the Royal Lyceum Theatre, the Traverse, Pitlochry Festival Theatre, MacRobert, Dundee Rep, Perth Theatre, the Tron, His Majesty's Aberdeen, Eden Court, Tramway and The Citizens Theatre Studio, as well as middle and small-scale touring venues all over Scotland and England. She has directed 31 productions for *A Play*, *A Pie and A Pint* at Oran Mor, Glasgow.

Her most recent work includes *Chanelling Jabez* at Nottingham Playhouse; *Faye's Red Lines* at Gilded Balloon; *Rollers Forever* at the Pavilion Theatre; *People in Cages* at The Drayton Arms; *90 Days: How Scotland Saved the 1994 Women's Rugby World Cup* at the Traverse; *Dead Dad Dog* at Finborough Theatre and the Traverse; *Quality Street*, *Para Handy* and *Perfect Days* for Pitlochry Festival Theatre; and a Scottish tour of *The Straw Chair* by Sue Glover.

Past productions have won the Scottish Theatre Awards on the Fringe Leading Light Award, the Guinness Pub Theatre Award, the LWT Plays on Stage Award and been nominated for the Critics' Awards for Theatre in Scotland for Best New Play and Best Production for Children and Young People. She has also been nominated for the Gaelic Awards for Best Arts Event.





LIGHTING DESIGN BY WAYNE DOWDESWELL

After training at Bristol Old Vic Theatre School, Wayne spent several seasons with Contact Theatre, Manchester, before joining the Royal Shakespeare Company. He spent many years as resident Lighting Supervisor at the Swan Theatre, Stratford on Avon, where numerous designs include: *The Fair Maid of the West*, *Titus Andronicus*, *Edward II*, *The Seagull*, *Tamburlaine the Great*.

In addition, she has designed shows for National Theatre of Scotland, Independent Art Projects, Sleeping Warrior, Scissor Kick, Polar Bears, Macrobert Arts Centre, Grid Iron, Heroica Theatre Company, Stellar Quines, Fish & Game, Aberdeen Arts Centre and Showroom, Borderline/Hirtle, Ros Sydney, A Moment's Peace, Grinagog, Cultured Mongrel Dance Theatre, Visible Fictions, Active Inquiry, Strange Town, Smallpetitklein, Eco Drama, Magnetic North, Birds of Paradise, and has been an Associate Designer with Punchdrunk/Imagine.



Claire has designed several events with Itison, *Glasgow* (2022, 2023, 2024 & 2025) and *Elfingrove* (Ice Rink 2021 & 2022) along with two film festivals for Tilda Swinton and Mark Cousins. For many years she has developed and created many interactive events and workshops for the Edinburgh International Science Festival including *Moments in Time* and *Ecoville* on the Mound in Edinburgh.

In 2013 she co-founded The Envelope Room, a network funded by Creative Scotland to support, promote and engage with performance designers in Scotland.



Teaching and mentoring include Design Tutor for Tron Design, Edinburgh College of Art, the University of the West of Scotland and Design Mentor with Royal Conservatoire of Scotland.

Claire is currently designing *Sweeney Todd* for Perth Youth Theatre and *Sailmaker* for Ayr Gaiety.
