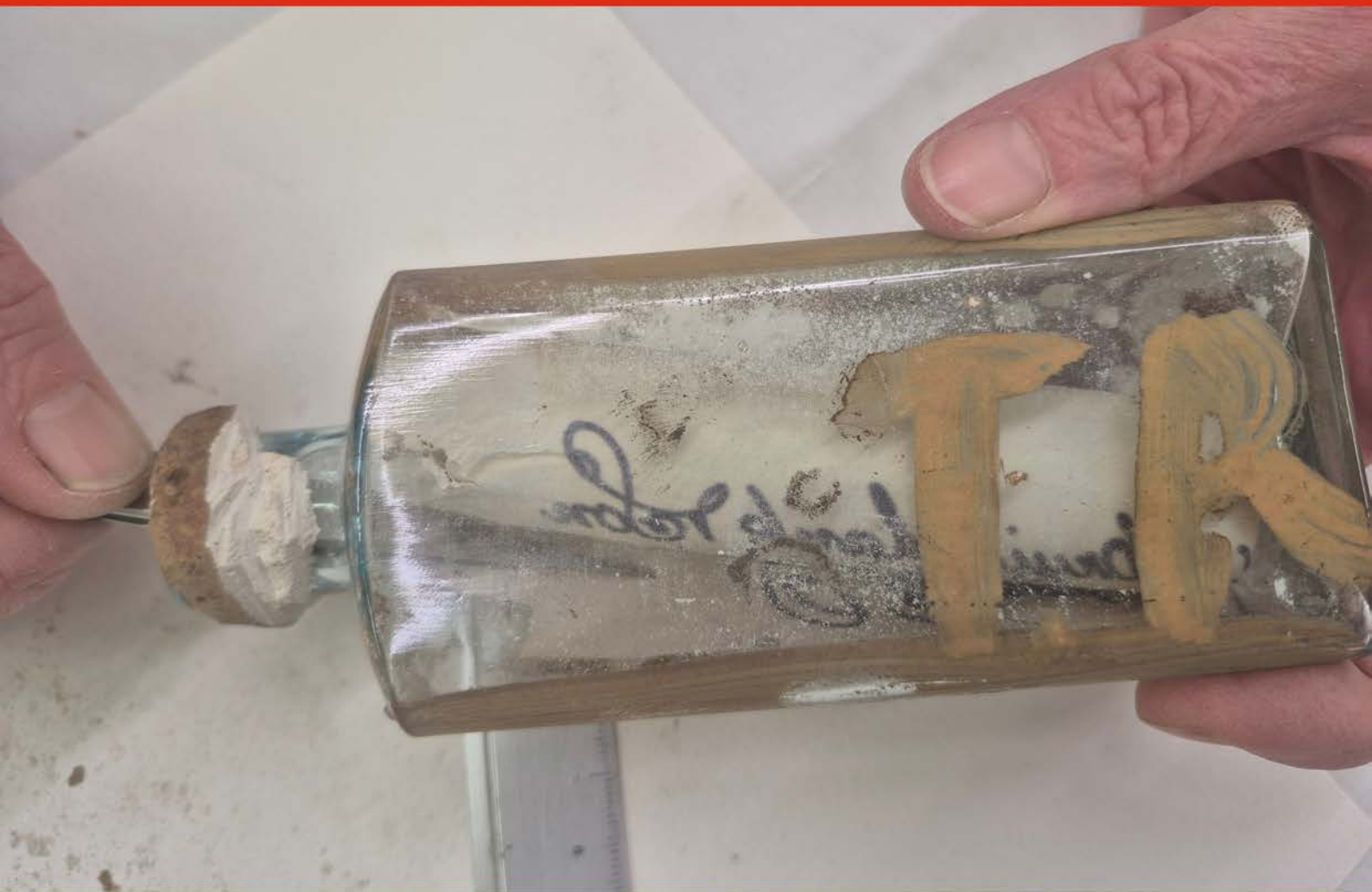

for teachers

This Create & Play resource is suitable for first pupils. This activity is most suited to expressive arts and social studies outcomes, with opportunities for pupils to develop literacy skills, as well as teaching pupils a little about The King's Theatre's redevelopment.

Two differentiated variants of the worksheet are included in this document to allow pupils to choose the appropriate level of challenge.

resources you need

- A5 message in a bottle worksheet
- recycled plastic bottles (1 per group)
- pens and pencils
- teabags (1 each)
- water cup (1 per group)
- sellotape

what happened?



In December 2024, when The King's was still a building site, we found something very special indeed.

During a fairly normal visit to check on the progress of the building work, theatre historian Mike Hume and Capital Theatres' Technical Director John Robb were rooting around right above the middle of the stage. There is a large crown decorating the area above the stage and inside it they found a message hidden in a bottle.

The letter was dated to October 1906, just two months before the very first show went on stage at The King's. How old does that make the letter? The message was a list of 16 names, all of people who had been involved in building the theatre. This included everyone from the people who owned the building company, the architects, and the plasterers.

Now it's your chance to leave your own message for the future. In your groups you're going to be given a bottle that you can put your own messages in. This group of men only passed on their names, but what else would you want to say to someone 120 years in the future?
